Four Year Sample Plan for students beginning at Covenant during the 2025-2026 academic year

This plan includes the courses needed to earn the bachelor of arts degree with a major in International Studies. Each student's plan may need to be customized to fit that student's interests and abilities; this should be done with the guidance of the director of the International Studies major.

The exemption from or completion of six (6) hours of intermediate level foreign language (such as FRE 201 and FRE 202, or SPA 201 and SPA 202) is required prior to pursuing the INS major's foreign language requirements. Students who are fluent/native in a language other than English may be eligible for additional exemptions, to be determined in consultation with the World Languages Department. The Cultural Perspectives, Humanities, and Social Science Distribution requirements are typically fulfilled by courses in the major.

Advanced placement (AP) credit for Comparative Politics does not exempt students from POL 200. The advanced placement hours awarded will be credited as electives towards the graduation requirement of 126 hours.

Students prusuing a major in International Studies undertake an academic study abroad, usually in the spring semester of the junior year or in the summer between the junior and senior years.
